

Universities

- Approx. 400 HEIs 148
 authorised to confer doctorates
- Almost 50,000 international researchers at German universities
- Principle of uniting learning, instruction and research
- Excellence Strategy = 533 million euros per year for cutting-edge research





Financing your Stay

- No tuition fees (except for private universities and universities in Baden-Württemberg)
- Living costs: approx. 860 € per month
- Can be self- or parent-financed (external funding)
- Financed by the German supervisor or host institution
- Individual funding: research associate contracts (part-time)
- Apply for a scholarship

DAAD programmes for Master and Phd-students

Long-term grants

1 - 4 years; apply in October value: 850–1,000 €/month + additional allowances

Short-term grants (also for Postdocs!)

1-6 months; apply in April or November value: 1,200 €/month + additional allowances

Summer programme

4 weeks; apply in December value: 950 € + additional allowances

Short term research and study visits

Who? University teachers, established academics& scientists with PhD degree

■ **Duration** 1 - 3 months

Value 2,000 - 2,150 €/month

Deadline April & October




